ON A COMPUTER

- 1 Using a public computer at Decatur Public Library, create a free, personal My EBSCOhost account.
- 2 Find an eBook you'd like to download (these titles will show up in our online catalog as electronic resources. Click on Downloadable button to be directed to EBSCOhost.
- 3 To read the book in your browser, select "PDF Full Text." To download to your personal computer, select Download This eBook (offline). You will be prompted to sign into your eBook account. Select the checkout period (in days) and tap Checkout and Download.
- 4 Open the folder and the book will download to Adobe Digital Editions (ADE). You will be provided a link if you need to download this free program.
- 5 To read, open ADE and double click your title. Use ADE to return your title.

ON A TABLET OR A SMART PHONE

- 1 Download the EBSCO eBook app from your app store.
- 2 Open the EBSCO eBooks app and follow the prompts to sign in or sign up.
- 3 Use the app's Find Books feature to find and download books to the app.
- 4 Select Decatur Pubic Library in Library Locator. The library name will be saved for future use in the app.
- 5 Search by title or category.
- 6 To check out, tap Download (offline), select the checkout period (in days), and tap Checkout and Download. Title will download to the app bookshelf.
